2015 ANNUAL REPORT MCDAC COMMITTEE REPORTS

Strategic Planning – Natalie Quint

Strategic planning sessions have been held throughout the year led by SSG Johnathan Oberholz, ILNG Counterdrug. We have been following the Strategic Prevention Framework model and have mostly completed the community assessment phase. We have reached this important juncture through a series of important meetings. The first was a roundtable discussion and public analysis of Illinois Youth Survey (IYS) data at the Metropolis Police Department (MPD). We concluded that there was an upward trend of use of particular substances, mostly marijuana and alcohol, between the 8^{th} and 10^{th} grades. A group of 17 participants discussed thoughts as to the reasons for this trend and possible solutions. The next phase was to specifically cite which issues we would focus on as a coalition and to construct problem/goal statements, which were completed in April. In May, we conducted a problem analysis for marijuana use and will complete one addressing alcohol use by December 2015. We still have to address community needs in our faith sector, with room to grow in our business sector, civic organization sector and our schools administration sector. Thank you SSG Oberholz for leading the strategic planning for the coalition, the MPD for hosting the roundtable discussion, and Dr. Sharon Burris for coordinating the IYS.

Rides to Recovery - Ellen Hearn

In the past year, we have received 4 request to provide rides to recovery services and have been able to make all 4 transports. One reason many individuals do not get help is because they do not have a ride so much thanks to our volunteers, Ricky Griffey, David Hearn, Steve Johnson, for providing this valuable transportation service to our community.

Red Ribbon Week Celebration – Sabrina Beck

Each year in October, Red Ribbon Week is celebrated to bring awareness to drug prevention. MCDAC participates by promoting the following activities in Massac County: Drug-free banners for the MJHS, MCHS, and JHS along with drug prevention items. Additional activities include: MJHS student council involvement with promoting activities, Centerpoint speakers visited classes at MCHS to share their experiences and journey to recovery. We are proud to bring drug prevention/education activities to over 2500 Massac County students for the past 3 years. We are able to continue providing this program through monetary and in-kind donations made by local organizations and volunteers in our community. Many thanks to all the volunteers, and to City National Bank for their donation of photocopying the coloring pages.

Youth Advisory Council: MCHS – Holly Windhorst

The 2014-2015 school year started off with 14 returning members and 6 additional applications. MCDAC purchased T-shirts with a YAC Logo for each of the YAC members. YAC members wore their t-shirts at the Youth Carnival that they organized for local K-8 grade students. With over 100 kids and parents, and over 30 volunteers, the carnival was a great success! They were very engaged and generated excitement

with the kids. They were also good at adapting game questions or activities for whatever different age appropriate groups playing. MCDAC sponsored an end-of-the-year bowling and pizza party for the YAC participants.

In July, Holly took 2 YAC members to the Cebrin Goodman Teen Institute, a 5-day youth leadership conference that offers opportunities for teens around the state to learn about leadership, healthy choices, and working with others to create better communities. The participants worked to formulate a Community Action Plan for the YAC to complete this fall.

Youth Advisory Council: MJHS – Sabrina Beck

In February 2nd and 4th, Sabrina Beck, Ricky Griffey, Holly Windhorst, Addie Gray spoke to MJHS students about the coalition and the upcoming Youth Carnival. In March, Sabrina spoke to the 7th and 8th grade students about starting a YAC at the junior high level, and received 8 student applications by end of day. A May 28th meeting was held with 7th graders to discuss the YAC and activities for the next school year. Any students interested in participating were invited to this meeting and 28 students attended. Our main goal is to organize and to sponsor the Red Ribbon Week activities for the junior high.

Grant/Fundraising Report – Natalie Quint

Southern Illinois Lutheran Synod – received \$750 to be used toward youth activities. Applied again, was awarded \$1,000 designated toward youth development. [Natalie]

United Way – We received a \$2,000 grant in 2014 but decided not to apply in 2015 due to the limited number of volunteers available to support United Way activities.

Drug Free Community Grant through SAMHSA

The Coalition decided to focus on assessment and strategic planning, then determine whether to apply in 2016.

Annual Golf Scramble – For the past 2 years Steve Johnson and David Hearn have planned, coordinated, and successfully hosted a golf scramble at the Metropolis Country Club. This is a great fundraising event for MCDAC. Thank you Steve and David for your continued support.
